THREE DAY INTRODUCTION TO TRADE WASTE MONITORING COURSE

The **Introduction to Trade Waste** monitoring training provides students with:

- **Confidence** to coordinate, implement and report on monitoring programs for trade waste treatment and disposal in retail commercial and light industrial organisations;
- **Techniques** to effectively sample trade effluents, with a particular focus on grease trap sampling;
- **Ability** to correctly calibrate basic test equipment and accurately perform basic field tests on trade effluents, with a particular focus on pH testing;
- **Skills and technical knowledge** to report investigation results and recommendations according to organisational requirements;
- **Awareness** of occupational health and safety issues, and skills which promote safe work habits.

Unit of Competency

Monitor trade waste approvals

Workshop Content

Sampling techniques, especially grease trap sampling

Performing and recording basic field observations and tests (pH)

Review and recording client data e.g. Flows, connections, maintenance records

OHS hazard identification and risk assessment, on clients' sites and relevant to handling samples collected for transfer to external laboratory

Students are expected to be working actively in the area of monitoring trade waste generating premises, to meet the assessment criteria. Student's employer will be responsible for securing access for the group to suitable trade waste generators' premises, for conduct of practical activities and WRA during the training.

The course content includes the completion of NWPTRD007. This unit of competency may be credit transferred towards the completion of either the Certificate III and Certificate IV in Water Industry Operations; or Diploma of Water Industry Operations.
